High School All-State Honors Choir Director



Dr. Joe Miller Director and Professor of Choral Studies University of Cincinnati

Recognized as a visionary conductor and creative artist, Joe Miller maintains an active performance schedule. Miller is a Professor of Conducting and Director of Choral Studies at CCM. In addition to his work at CCM, Miller is artistic director of choral activities for the renowned Spoleto Festival USA in Charleston, South Carolina, and since 2016 he has served as conductor of the Philadelphia Orchestra Symphonic Choir.

Miller made his conducting debut with the Philadelphia Orchestra in 2021, conducting Handel's *Messiah*. Recent collaborations with Yannick Nézet-Séguin and the Philadelphia Orchestra have included premiere performances of Kevin Puts' *The Hours* with Renée Flemming, Kelli O'Hara, and Jennifer Johnson Cano, along with premier performances in Carnegie Hall of Gabriela

Franks' *Pachamama Meets and Ode*. Past seasons' engagements included Beethoven's *Ninth Symphony* with the Spoleto Festival USA Orchestra and Chorus and Poulenc's *Stabat Mater* with the CCM Choirs and Philharmonia.

Featured works of the 2022-23 CCM season include performances for the ACDA National Conference, Joby Talbot's *Path of Miracles*, and a collaboration with the Cincinnati Ballet featuring the CCM Chamber Choir and choreographer Taylor Carrasco. The Philadelphia Orchestra season includes Rachmaninov Kolokolo/The Bells being recorded for Deutsche Gramophone, Handel's *Messiah*, and the Bruckner *Te Deum*.

After viewing a staged performance of Joby Talbot's demanding *Path of Miracles* at the 2019 Spoleto Festival USA, D.C. *Theatre Scene* wrote, "Joe Miller is a fearless artist. His bold leadership and trust in these young singers enabled his choristers to forego the 'stand and deliver,' score-bound habits of their genre and 'walk with him' on this special journey. Not only did the singers need to memorize their parts, no mean feat, but followed his baton's bid from any part of the auditorium and sang in any body position. Miller constantly challenged them in the process and inspired them to work confidently, well outside their comfort zone."

Miller's ensembles have performed throughout the world, giving concert tours in Italy, Germany, Austria, France, England, China, and Spain, as well as participating in the World Symposium on Choral Music in Barcelona. His choirs have toured extensively throughout the US performing for the American Choral Director's Association National and Regional Conferences, and including groundbreaking performances of Julia Wolfe's Pulitzer Prize-winning Anthracite Fields at the historic Roebling WireWorks as part of Westminster's Transforming Space project.

Miller has been praised for his recordings. *American Record Guide's* review of *Frank Martin: Mass for Double Choir* stated: "This is gorgeous singing ... with perfect blend, intonation, diction, ensemble and musicality." *The Heart's Reflection: Music of Daniel Elder* was hailed by Minnesota Public Radio's *Classical Notes* as "simply astounding." Miller's debut recording with the Westminster Choir, *Flower of Beauty*, received four stars from *Choir & Organ* magazine and earned critical praise from *American Record Guide*, which described the Westminster Choir as "the gold standard for academic choirs in America."

All-State Musical Theatre Honors Ensemble Director

Mr. Michael K. Hancey Arts Educator, Conductor, and Playwright

Mr. Michael K. Hancey began his teaching career in 1991, having graduated from the University of Utah with a Bachelor of Music Degree with a choral emphasis. He has taught in Arizona, Wisconsin, Idaho (where he earned his Master's Degree in Administration and



Supervision), and finally teaching in Wyoming. Over the course of his career, he has taught at all levels of education from kindergarten to high school seniors.

He taught elementary music, junior high choir, senior high choir, Spanish, Musical Theatre, AP Music Theory, Drama 1 & 2, Theatre Tech, Shakespeare through Film, Bach to Rock, and many other courses. He served as Department Chair multiple times, on various curriculum committees, as high school principal, as Theatre Manager, and other roles within education.

As a teacher, his choirs toured the United States, Ireland, and Western Europe winning multiple awards. He has served as Wyoming President of ACDA, Jazz Choir conductor for Wyoming Ambassadors of Music, and has conducted various community and religious-based choirs.

He has directed over twenty Musical Theatre productions including "Something Rotten!", "Bye, Bye Birdie", "Mamma Mia!", "White Christmas", "Pippin", "Beauty and the Beast", "Into the Woods", "The Addams Family", "Peter Pan"," Les Miserables School Edition", "Singin' in the Rain", "Cinderella" and many, many more. He has also directed multiple plays including "Blithe Spirit", "1984", "Romeo and Juliet", "Almost, Maine", "The Laramie Project", "Alice in Wonderland", "You Can't Take It With You", "12 Angry Jurors", and many more.

Mr. Hancey retired from teaching in 2022 and currently resides in western New York with his partner Cyndi, and cat Hamilton, he also works as a playwright and in Human Resources for a major home improvement retailer.
